- Please note that if your child is unwell enough to need medication, then they should be at home. We are able to administer medication under the following circumstances *only*:
 - Travel sickness medication
 - The remainder of a course of antibiotics, provided a Dr has said the child is well enough to attend school
 - Regular medication agreed on health care plans
 - Allergy medication
 - Paracetamol after a procedure, provided the child is cleared to be in school by a Dr
- If we are administering medication we will need the following:
 - Clearly marked medication with the child's name and dosage
 - A letter signed by the parent or carer giving permission for us to administer the medication
 - A Health Care Plan for ongoing medication
